FUNDING THE FUTURE

Each year, Christian Evangelistic Mission invests in church planting in several ways. We give annual salary support to the pastors who start new churches or new campus sites for healthy existing churches. We provide one-time gifts to church planting projects so they can get up and going. We invest in church residencies to train future pastors. Last, in partnership with Nexus and the Bonhoeffer Project, we provide scholarships to men and women to build a disciple-making plan for their ministry context.

While regular monthly gifts and one-time support to CEM throughout the year cover overall funding to complete our mission, the Harvest Offering funds go toward specific, time-bound projects for the upcoming year. Last year, the Harvest Offering topped \$75,000 and provided salary support for two new churches, three part-time residencies, and 13 Bonhoeffer Project scholarships for discipleship training. Wow! That's the direct impact of Harvest Offering donations last year!

This year's challenge is to go beyond our 2022 goal (\$75,000) and raise \$85,000 by the end of 2023. As of mid-November, donors have given nearly \$38,000 total, and we have another \$12,000 committed to the Harvest Offering to round out November. \$50,000 has been raised, praise God!

CATALYST

On November 3rd and 4th, CEM held their 5th Annual Catalyst Conference in Marion, Iowa. Guest speaker Guy Hammond equipped attendees with tools to bridge the gap between Christians and the LGBTQ community. Guy shared his own story of same-sex attraction and how God led him away from the homosexual lifestyle to follow Christ completely. He teaches Christian audiences how to instill compassion, grace, and biblical truth when communicating with others who experience same-sex attraction.

Guy explained pro-gay theology and compared it to what the bible teaches instead. He presented ways to respectfully and lovingly share our faith with same-sex attracted people. Parents and youth leaders learned how to guide kids through the confusion they may face at school and or social groups. Finally, Guy shared what ministry leaders need to know regarding transgenderism issues churches may face.

Our gracious hosts, Antioch Christian Church, welcomed people from across the state to their main campus and live-streamed the conference for those who lived further away. Five churches hosted the live stream for registered attendees; another 20+ individuals joined from their homes. We also had 30 pastors join

Guy Hammond for a special luncheon. **Thank you, Antioch, for your hospitality!**

In total, over 130 people were blessed by Guy Hammond's teaching! His content has spurred quality conversations among lowa church leaders, and several churches have invited him back to lowa.



BONHOEFFER PROJECT RECAP

Christians generally agree that we are all to make disciples who follow Christ (Matt 28:18-20). However, the intention to make disciples requires a plan. If there is no plan, we don't really intend to do it. The Bonhoeffer Project helps each participant craft a biblically sound plan that fits their ministry context.

After a 10-month commitment to intensive study on disciple-making, eleven men and two women completed the Bonhoeffer Project in November 2023. The process includes studying the Gospels, reading three additional books, 30 hours of cohort training, monthly homework, and designing a disciple-making plan to be implemented in the participant's ministry context. The culminating result of CEM's first year

of cohorts means eleven churches will benefit from implementing these plans. The greater narrative of the Bonhoeffer Project is that every follower of Christ is making disciples who make disciples.
